Africa Association of Bible Schools (AABS) has developed a Bible curriculum that has been shared in sixteen countries throughout Africa. PTW Ministries has partnered with AABS to advance the Gospel and equip Kenyan pastors through the AABS Bible study curriculum. We now act as the "Kenyan director of the AABS program. The government in Kenya has begun targeting pastors who are not "qualified" or have no formal training to be leading their churches. However, these church leaders typically do not have the finances to attend seminary or receive a ministry license.

We recognized this problem in the onset of 2020 and knew that we could be a part of moving towards the solution. We were delighted to partner with AABS, as they carry similar vision and passion for Africa.

By providing affordable resources to Bible schools in rural and urban areas in Kenya, it gives pastors and leaders the ability to have a certificate, eventually recognized by the government, to continue their Church ministry. We do not own or run any of the Bible Schools, we only equip them with tools and resources to make Bible education affordable for their community.

This year, the first AABS Kenya Bible School opened. Located a few hours from the capital city, in a town called Embu, we have forty students who meet on Saturdays.

Within the next three years, our vision is to see the eagerness and hunger for the Bible multiplied to more schools. We want to announce it at our upcoming Pastors Conference to engage new pastors in our program, see at least three new schools established with our current leads, and have our first class graduate.
